






Challenges in Kent and Medway

Our population is growing

About 1.8 million people live in Kent and Medway. By 2031 this number will increase by almost a quarter, compared to 2011



More people have long-term conditions like diabetes, lung and heart disease



The number of people **over the age of 70 will rise** by 20% in the next 5 years



1 in 4 people in Kent and Medway have a mental health problem



Challenges in Kent and Medway

As many as four in 10 emergency admissions to hospital could be avoided if the right care was available in the community



We have real challenges recruiting enough GPs and practice nurses

- **intervene earlier** before people need to go to hospital.




How it will work in Ashford



- **Ashford Clinical Providers –**
more joined-up working
- Joined-up nursing service – eg wound care, catheter care
- Specialist GPs – eg cardiology, diabetes
- Community geriatricians
- Consultant clinics at local level
- Health and social care joined-up teams
- Links to voluntary sector
- Improved access to minor injuries services

Impact on infrastructure

- Shift of care towards community will increase use of GP surgery premises
- 2015-2017, there was an increase in practice population of nearly 5000 patients
- Predicted future growth across Ashford greatly outweighs any remaining capacity in the current premises

Planning future infrastructure

- CCG currently working with ABC Planning team on Local Plan developments
- Identified areas of significant growth
- CCG intention to work on developing tariff system for S106
 - 0-10 properties – No S106
 - 10-50 properties – Agree tariff for planners to automatically include in S106
 - Over 50 properties – assess developer plan against existing S106 and GP premises
