75 Background and Principles of Political Balance and Administrative Structure

The Member Services Manager introduced the report which presented the Political Balance for the Authority for the remainder of the 2023/24 Municipal Year, and sought to agree any other constitutional matters which needed to be recommended to the Meeting of the Full Council on the 20th July 2023. There was a change to the balance following the decision of Councillors Barrett and Buchanan to leave the Conservative Group and become Independent Councillors. The agreed Political Balance is contained at Appendix A to these Minutes.

The Member Services Manager ran through the membership of Committees and Board in Appendix B to the report one by one. With input from Members, the proposed membership for 2023/24 was completed including the nominations for Chairmen and Vice-Chairmen. This is contained at Appendix B to these Minutes.

Recommended:

The Solicitor to the Council and Monitoring Officer explained that the report sought to extend the delegation previously given to him to make additional formal Trustee or Voting Member appointments, subject to the receipt of confirmation that they were reasonably required and that appropriate insurances were in place for each year of appointments to protect against risk of personal liability arising from undertaking the role.

Resolved:

That the Committee delegate the making of the formal Trustee or Voting Member annual appointments to those bodies now asking for the appointments to be made in capacities other than a Liaison Member, (or any other organisations who subsequently request), to the Solicitor to the Council and Monitoring Officer. Appointments will be subject to the Solicitor to the Council being satisfied that they are reasonably required by reason of



statutory or constitutional provisions and that appropriate insurances are in place for each year of appointment to protect against risk of personal liability arising from undertaking the role in question.

It is therefore proposed that Councillor Buchanan is offered this seat. It is also proposed for Councillor Buchanan to be offered the seat on the Selection and Constitutional Review Committee. With regard to the vacant seat on the Planning Committee, both Independent Councillors have declined this seat. Given that all Groups have received their overall entitlement to seats across all Committees under the draft calculation, no other Group is entitled to take this seat. Summary:

The purpose of this report is to review the proposals arising from a statutory review of parliamentary polling districts and places. A consultation on the proposed polling districts and places was held in the period beginning 25 September 2023 and concluding on 23rd October 2023

Report Title: Review of Parliamentary Polling Districts and Places 2023

Introduction and Background

- 1. Section 18C of the Representation of the People Act 1983 requires every local authority to conduct a full review of parliamentary polling districts and places every five years. The next statutory review period is from 1st October 2023 to 31st January 2025.
- It is the duty of the council of each district or London Borough to divide their area into polling districts for the purpose of UK parliamentary elections for so much of any constituency as is situated in their area and to keep those districts under review.
- 3. An interim review was undertaken in 2022 in advance of the 2023 Borough and Parish elections.
- 4. The Local Government and Polling Districts Task Group met on 31st October 2023 to consider the proposed polling districts and polling places.
- 5. New parliamentary constituencies will be in place for the next UK parliamentary elections. The Returning Officer for Ashford will be responsible for two parliamentary constituencies, Ashford County Constituency and the Weald of Kent County Constituency. Ashford CC will include two wards in Folkestone & Hythe. The Weald of Kent constituency will include seven wards in Maidstone and two in Tunbridge Wells.
- 6. The review of polling districts, place and stations in Folkestone & Hythe, Maidstone and Tunbridge Wells is the responsibility of those Local Authorities although the Ashford Returning Officer will be asked for her comments.

Recommendations

- 7. The Local Government and Polling District Task Group recommends that the Selection and Constitutional Review Committees approves the polling district scheme as per **Appendix 1** attached and designates each ward as the polling place.
- 8. That the Selection and Constitutional Review Committee delegates the power to make changes to polling places to the Returning Officer/Acting Returning Officer for each election held in Ashford.
- 9. The report recommends the following changes to the current arrangements
 - Beaver Ward: in polling District BE1–Beaver, move the polling station from Beaver Green Primary school to a temporary building within the polling district if a suitable site for a temporary building can be located.
 If a suitable site cannot be found, the school will be used.

- Goat Lees Ward: Incorporate the properties in polling district DW4X-Sandyhurst Farm into polling district GL1- Boughton Aluph and delete polling district DW4X as DW4X is now within Goat Lees Ward.
- Tenterden North: Combine polling districts TN1 Homewood with polling district TN2 East Cross as they share a polling place and are within the same ward, parish and county boundary.
- Weald Central: New polling station located in the Community Management Office, Chilmington Green to serve polling district WC2 – Chilmington Green.
- 10. In some cases it has not been possible to find a suitable location for a polling station within the polling district or ward. The Selection and Constitution Committee are requested to designate the following polling places located outside of the ward as polling places for the polling districts listed:

TERM OF OFFICE OF LEADER OF THE COUNCIL

Introduction

 At its meeting on 13 June 2023 the Overview & Scrutiny Committee recommended that this Committee should receive a report regarding the term of office of the Leader of the Council (currently a four year term) and whether this should be recommended for amendment to provide for an annual election of the Leader of the Council.

At its meeting on 19 July 2023 the Council agreed that a report should be presented to this Committee.

Legal & Constitutional Position

- 2. The Council's Constitution provides in Article 7.02 that the Leader of the Council will be elected by the Council and the term of office begins on the day of election to the office and ends on the day of the next post Local Election Annual Meeting which follows his/her election as Leader. This is normally a four year period. The current Leader of the Council was so elected in May 2023.
- 3. In an election year the Leader holds over pending election of a new Leader even if not re-elected at the local elections.
- 4. Article 7.02 further provides that the Leader holds office for that term unless he/she resigns, is no longer a councillor (other than by expiration of office) or is removed from office by resolution of the Council on the basis of a motion process set out in Article 7.02.
- 5. The statutory background to the Council's constitutional provisions on the Leader of the Council is as follows.
 - The Local Government Act 2000 allowed the Council to choose the term of office of the Leader. The Local Government & Public Involvement in Health Act 2007 inserted new provisions at s.44 A-D of the 2000 Act prescribing that the Leader's term of office end on the post —election Annual Meeting following his/her election as Leader ie effectively a 4 year term of office. The Council's Constitution currently reflects this 4 year term provision.
- 6. The Localism Act 2011 inserted further provisions regarding the Leader of the Council into the Local Government Act 2000 which re-introduced a discretion in place of the mandatory four year term. It also required provisions to be included in Constitution regarding removal of the Leader by resolution of the Council and their continuation in office until replaced even at the end of an electoral term.
- 7. The Council was and is under no obligation to amend the current provisions on the Leader's term of office. However it does have a discretion to do so.

Key Considerations

- 8. The principle of a 4 year term of office for the Leader was introduced by the 2007 Act as part of the promotion of the "strong leadership" Model by Government at the time. The intention was to promote stability and continuity and allow a Leader and an administration to implement medium and longer term strategies and policies with less difficulty.
- 9. Although a 4 year term does not make allowances for changes within an administration or changes to the overall political landscape during the term, there are provisions which allow the Council to remove the Leader by resolution at any time.
- 10. Nonetheless members will wish to consider whether the annual election of the Leader of the Council (who would hold office until the day of the next Annual Meeting) is preferred to the current 4 year term. This would provide a process for regular planned consideration of potential change as an alternative to the removal by resolution of the council at any time. However the latter process must also by law still be available within the Constitution.

Conclusions

- 11. If this Committee wishes to recommend a change from the current 4 year term for the Leader to provide for annual election of the Leader at the Annual Meeting then it is recommended it does so on the following terms. This would mean the next election of Leader takes place at the Annual Meeting in May 2024:
 - (i) the Constitution be amended with immediate effect to state that the term of office of the Leader is one year (although the Leader may serve consecutive one year terms up to a maximum of four years following each local election if so elected at each Annual Meeting)
 - (ii) the other existing provisions in the Constitution in respect of resignation of the Leader and the removal and replacement of the Leader and the term of office in an election year remain in place.
 - (iii) the Monitoring Officer be authorised to amend any other relevant references in the Constitution to reflect the change in term of office.

TERM OF OFFICE FOR MAYOR

Introduction

- 1. At its meeting on 13 June 2023 the Overview & Scrutiny Committee recommended that this Committee should receive a report to consider whether the term of office on election of the Mayor should be extended to up two years. This recommendation regarding a report was agreed by Council at its meeting on 19 July 2023.
- The Overview & Scrutiny Committee considered that allowing extension of the term of election could ease difficulties sometimes encountered with identifying candidates each year under the current arrangements.

Legal & Constitutional Position

- 3. Section 3(1) of the The Local Government Act 1972 provides that "the Chairman of a principal council shall be elected annually by the Council from among the councillors".
- 4. The Mayor's statutory role includes chairmanship of the Council and so s.3 applies to election of the mayor. **Accordingly it is not legally possible to elect a mayor for a term of more than one year.**
- 5. There is nothing in the law or in the Council's Constitution which prevents a mayor from being elected for a second successive year. However this is a matter for the Council to decide at each annual election process at the Annual Meeting and cannot be predetermined in advance in a single election process. Clearly if the Council wished to elect a mayor for a second successive year then it would need to take into account the position of the Deputy Mayor who would normally expect to succeed the mayor upon completion of one year in office.
- 6. Relevant provisions of the Council's Constitution are as follows (Selection of Mayor and Term of Office Part 5 Codes & Protocols)
 - "The term of office of Mayor and Deputy Mayor will normally be for one year"
 [as indicated above, a mayor can be elected for a second successive year but cannot be elected for a two year term in advance. Article 5 of
 - "The Deputy Mayor will normally succeed the Mayor (subject to review in election year)"

the Constitution correctly states that the mayor is elected annually]

 "There is a presumption against Members serving a second term as Mayor and Deputy Mayor if other willing candidates exist but this is ultimately a matter for decision of the Council"

7. The Constitution also sets out the process for Mayor and Deputy Mayor nominations. This includes recommendations by Group Leaders to this Committee immediately preceding the Annual Meeting. This does not preclude other nominations being made at the Annual Meeting itself although the protocol states this "should be avoided where possible".

Conclusion

8. Whilst it is not legally possible to elect a Mayor (Chairman) for a term exceeding one year in advance, there is nothing in the law or the Council's Constitution which prevents the Council from electing a Mayor or Deputy Mayor for a second successive term.
